Regular Meeting:

The City Clerk submitted Appropriation Ordinance No. 1697 to the Governing Body for their consideration and approval. After careful review and discussion thereof, Commissioner Ditto moved, seconded by Commissioner Faulkner, to approve and adopt Appropriation Ordinance Number 1697. Motion carried. Aye: 4, Nay: 0.

Public Comments and Communications:

The next regular work session will be August 06, 2024, at 4:30 p.m.

Doug Adams was present to introduce himself to the Governing Body as one of the candidates running for Pottawatomie County Sheriff.

Revenue Neutral Rate:

The City Manager advised the mill levy last year was 43.923 and she plans to match the mill levy, the revenue neutral rate that the county gave is 42.428, therefore it is her recommendation to notify the county clerk of the city intention to exceed the revenue neutral rate. Commissioner Ditto moved, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs to notify the county clerk of the intention to exceed the revenue neutral rate. Motion carried. Aye: 4, Nay: 0.

Set Budget Hearing:

Stacie Eichem advised that a public hearing for the Revenue Neutral Rate (RNR) and the Budget needed to be scheduled. Commissioner Baughman moved, seconded by Commissioner Ditto, to set the RNR and budget hearing on September 3, 2024, at 6 pm at the City Office. Motion carried. Aye: 4, Nay: 0.

Concrete Proposal Review:

The City Manager advised that two proposals had been submitted for various concrete work throughout the city. It would be her recommendation to accept the lowest proposal from Bayer Construction at \$31,504. Commissioner Ditto moved, seconded by Commissioner Faulkner, to accept Bayer Construction's proposal in the amount of \$31,504. Motion carried. Aye: 4, Nay: 0.

Asphalt Proposal Review:

Stacie Eichem advised that one proposal had been received for various asphalt mill and overlay locations within the city from Shilling Construction in the amount of \$103,059 to begin in August. Commissioner Faulkner moved, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs, to accept Shilling's proposal in the amount of \$103,059. Motion carried. Aye: 4, Nay: 0.

Rifle Proposal Review:

The City Manager advised that two proposals have been received for rifles for the police department. Due to discrepancies in a possibly backordered item, Stacie asked that this issue be tabled for more information, the issues was tabled by general consensus.

Standard Traffic Ordinance:
