## **ORDINANCE NO. 1811**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WAMEGO, KANSAS, AMENDING CHAPTER XV. UTILITIES ARTICLE 5. LEAF, LIMB AND GRASS BURN SITE, SETTING FORTH REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES GOVERNING THE USE OF THE SITE; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WAMEGO, KANSAS:

Section 1. That CHAPTER XV. UTILITIES of the Code of the City of Wamego, Kansas, be and the same is hereby amends Article 5. to read as follows:

## "ARTICLE 5. SOLID WASTE

15-513

LEAF, LIMB AND GRASS BURN SITE; PUBLIC USE RESTRICTIONS.

- (a) The city may maintain a Leaf, Limb and Grass Burn Site for use by City of Wamego residents and property owners for debris from within the city limits and the City of Wamego employees performing city duties, subject to the regulations and penalties set forth under this Article. Commercial arborists and landscapers are prohibited from using the facility.
- (b) SAME; REGULATIONS. Disposal of plastic bags, trash and construction materials is not permitted. Disposed limbs shall not exceed six inches in diameter, nor have lengths exceeding five feet.
- (c) It shall be unlawful to dispose of any materials other than those specified above.
- (d) SAME; VIOLATION AND PENALTIES. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction or a plea of guilty may be fined in any sum less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 2. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication in the City's official paper, The Times
